The Chain Effect

Grades 2–3

Books open doors to a multitude of volunteering possibilities by showing kids that there are volunteer opportunities for every interest, talent, and passion. The I Can Make a Difference series from Heinemann includes volunteering to help animals, family and friends, the community, and the environment. Each book discusses the purpose of volunteering and describes simple tasks children can do. Use all four books in the series or find similar books from your collection that will assist students in developing ideas for volunteering. (Remind students about using nonfiction text features to find information.)

Split students into four groups. Give books on one topic to each group of students and distribute a paper doll cutout to each student. The students should write one volunteering idea on each paper doll. Tape the paper dolls together after students read the tasks to the class. Create chains for each of the topics and post where other classes can read the ideas. Spend time as a whole class sharing ideas about why it is good to volunteer.

Volunteer StarsGrade 4–5

Have students interview local volunteers. View the short YouTube video interview of a football team that executed a very special play that enabled a child with a disability to score a touchdown (http://tinyurl.com/l6vwssz). Discuss what the team did, why they did it, and the results. Watch it a second time to focus on the questions asked by the interviewer. Compile a list of questions that students can use when interviewing a volunteer.

Invite parent volunteers from the school or reach out to community organizations. Have students work in pairs to interview a volunteer, write up a summary, and present their findings to the class. Spotlight these wonderful volunteers by posting the summaries and a picture of the volunteer on a Volunteer Star Wall.
